Operation and Maintenance

On-going Maintenance

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TSSWCB O&M grant program funded fence replacement underway this week at Site 10 with Espinoza Fence low bidder. 100% funding (including ECWA In-Kind credit)

Solicitation for spring maintenance sent to three contractors for quotes. This includes: fertilization (12 sites covering 170.2 acres); broadleaf weed treatment (19 sites covering a total of 254.3 acres); mowing (15 sites covering 141.5 acres). These will be awarded individually to the low bidder. TSSWCB O&M grant program funding is approved for these maintenance activities. 100% funding (including ECWA In-Kind credit)

Additional fences in need of replacement include Site 11 (poor condition; to secure from trespass and vandalism) and Site 19 (poor condition; fence damage during grass fire a couple years ago). TSSWCB has indicated there will be funding available through this July for O&M grant program, but future funding from legislature is not a certainty. Recommendation is to get these done soon while program funds are available and before In-Kind credit expires this August.

Dam Safety Inspections

Annual inspections completed at all 34 dams during December. This included formal TCEQ inspections conducted by dam safety engineer at 8 sites: 1, 2, 4, 5A, 8, 10, 21, 22. The TCEQ inspection is conducted every 5 years on all high hazard and significant hazard dams. Remaining TCEQ inspection will be done over the next couple of months at the 4 remaining high/significant hazard dams: 23, 28, 30, 39.

TSSWCB O&M Program Agreement with Central Texas SWCD

The Central Texas Soil and Water Conservation District has submitted an agreement for renewal that would continue allowing ECWA to pursue and expedite participation and funding through the TSSWCB Operation and Maintenance (O&M) Grant Program. In return ECWA would continue to share the 5% reimbursement for administration 50-50 with the SWCD.

TSSWCB Repair Program

Plunge Basin Repairs

Sites 26, 31, 32: Site 26 repair completed, with final check today. Equipment moved to Site 31 and work to proceed as weather and site conditions allow. Pipe manufacturing complete for replacement at Site 32, with delivery to coincide with mobilization to that site.

Sites 37, 38, 43: Solicitation process for this final contract package will proceed approximately 45 days before completion of 26, 31, 32 contract. Will be monitoring progress and weather delays to project completion.



Dam Upgrades

Designs for upgrades at Sites 23 and 39 are near completion. On December 29, 2020 the TSSWCB sent a letter with a list of State funded dam upgrade projects where funding will be available to begin construction **this summer**. This list includes Sites 23 and 39. Agreements are expected to come later his month. Contracting for construction should be done **by the end of May** and actual construction **must be underway by July 2021**.

The contractor working on designs is handling 404 permitting, environmental, and cultural resources compliance. The acquisition of and assurances of adequate land rights is **the responsibility of the local sponsor**. Consequently, ECWA will need to move quickly to secure agreements with property owners at the two sites. Delay in acquiring additional easements needed for the upgrades could jeopardize over \$6.5 million in State funds.

Initial proposals for agreements to acquire additional easements have been made by three of the four property owners at Site 23 and the individual owner at Site 39. The ECWA board will need to consider these proposals and respond to property owners.

Elm Creek Watershed Authority, Board of Directors, met in regular session on January 14, 2021, at 19 South 25th Street, Suite 500, Temple, Texas

Directors present: Steve Rieves, Daniel C. Lesikar, Ray Jungmann, Mike Maedgen, Robert Fleming, Bobby Henson and Arvell Jungmann

Others present: Calvin Sanders and Tricia Mackie

The meeting was called to order by Daniel C. Lesikar, Chairman, at 7:00 p.m.

Consent Agenda: Bobby Henson made a motion to approve the previous meeting minutes as mailed. The motion was second by Ray Jungmann. Motion passed.

Income and Disbursements were read aloud by Tricia Mackie. A motion was made by Bobby Henson to receive, approve and file income and disbursements for December 2020. Arvell Jungmann second the motion. Motion passed. A motion was made by Bobby Henson to receive, approve and file income and disbursements for January 2021. Ray Jungmann second the motion. Motion passed.

Tricia Mackie reviewed the 2020 4th Quarter Financial Report. Robert Fleming made a motion to approve the report as presented. The motion was second by Arvell Jungmann. Motion passed.

Watershed Report: The watershed report was presented by Calvin Sanders. O&M: Fence replacement on Site 10 is underway. IFB have been mailed for spring O&M, with 100% funding available through TSSWCB due to in-kind credit. Site 11 & 19 have fencing in poor condition. TSSWCB funding is available through July 2021 for fence replacements. Mr. Sanders is not certain funding will be available from state legislature in the near future and recommends replacing the fences on these sites using credits. In-kind credit expires in August 2021.

Dam Safety Inspections: NRCS has inspected 8 high hazard dams; results-dams are well cared for. TCEQ may have to inspect the Falls County dam.

TSSWCB Pgm: Site 26 repairs completed and contractor has begun work on Site 31. IFB packet for repairs on Sites 37, 38 & 43 will be sent out approximately 45 days before completion of Site 32 repairs. Central Texas SWCD has submitted a renewal agreement for administration cost share for 2 additional years.

Dam Upgrades: Designs for Sites 23 & 39 are near completion with construction possible this summer. Contracting needs to be ready by the end of May with construction starting in July. Design contractor is completing USACOE 404 permit and other compliance requirements. ECWA must get land rights for additional easements to proceed. Initial proposals for easements have been received from several of the landowners. The board asked Mr. Sanders to work with attorney on easements, and acceptance of proposals.

A motion was made by Bobby Henson to approve the watershed report. Mike Maedgen second the motion. Motion passed.

ECWA Website: The board asked Mrs. Mackie to consult with attorney for the need/requirement to have a website.

Adjourn: Arvell Jungmann made a motion to adjourn. Ray Jungmann second the motion. Motion passed. Meeting adjourned at 8:24 p.m.
