#### **Operation and Maintenance**

#### Spring Vegetative Maintenance

Requests for bids will be prepared and sent out around February 1 for fertilization (13 sites/160.3 acres) and weed spraying (32 sites/361.2 acres).

Funding is approved through the TSSWCB O&M grant program that will cover 90% of the cost, however the amount per acre for fertilization will likely be significantly more than that approved. TSSWCB has obligated all funds for the O&M program, so ECWA will be responsible for the difference. \$130 per acre is the approved amount. The difference could be up to \$50 per acre with the total increased by about \$8000, making the total ECWA cost around \$10000. That would result in a cost of about \$63 per acre to ECWA as opposed to the \$13 per acre approved. ECWA would be able to claim the difference as in-kind credit that could be applied to the ECWA 10% share of approved O&M program activities through August 2023.

#### Dam Safety and Emergency Action Plans

M&E Engineering Consultants is working on the updates to the inundation maps and related information required by TCEQ for each of the 12 emergency action plans. Progress has been delayed, but these should be completed soon.

#### **TSSWCB** Dam Upgrade Program

#### <u>Site 23</u>

Easements have been acquired and an opinion of adequate land rights has been submitted by attorney Jamey Secrest. The NRCS form ADS-78 "Assurances of Real Property" is prepared and ready for signature by the board. This is the final item required to move forward with construction. A reimbursement request has been prepared to recover a portion of the land rights costs, including survey (\$3500), legal (\$1802.20), and payments to property owners in exchange for easements (\$130,277).

ECWA has coordinated with the TSSWCB and contracting consultant Kat Pinckney about advertising for bids. There is not enough money to cover construction and contingencies due to cost increases since the funding agreement in May 2021. ECWA will either have to wait for the possibility of additional state funds after September 1 or cover the entire amount if bids were to come in over the \$3.6 million in the project agreement. Based on most recent cost estimate, the increase is \$764,655. AECOM is reviewing the cost estimate to see if it could be lowered enough to solicit bids.

#### <u>Site 39</u>:

Yesterday we received confirmation from attorney Brian Carroll that his firm will represent ECWA the eminent domain case for easements at Site 39. He indicated that he would be drafting paperwork to begin the process next week. We will need to order an appraisal for the 3.81 acres of additional permanent easement as required by law for eminent domain cases.

Elm Creek Watershed Authority, Board of Directors, met in regular session on January 13, 2022, at 19 South 25<sup>th</sup> Street, Suite 500, Temple, Texas

Others present: Calvin Sanders and Tricia Mackie

The meeting was called to order by Daniel C. Lesikar, Chairman, at 6:59 p.m.

**Consent Agenda:** Minutes: Bobby Henson made a motion to approve the previous meeting minutes as mailed. The motion was second by Ray Jungmann. Motion passed.

Income and Disbursements were read aloud by Tricia Mackie. A motion was made by Bobby Henson to receive, approve and file income and disbursements. Arvell Jungmann second the motion. Motion passed.

Budget: Tricia Mackie informed the board of end of year expenses and adjustments that needed attention. Mike Maedgen made a motion to amend the budget by decreasing Downstream Structures \$3800.00, increasing Allocations \$300.00, Insurance \$1000.00 and Payroll \$2500.00. The motion was second by Robert Fleming. Motion passed.

Quarterly Report: Bobby Henson made a motion to accept and file the 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter 2021 report. Ray Jungmann second the motion. Motion passed.

**Watershed Report:** The watershed report was presented by Calvin Sanders. O&M: Request for bids for fertilization and weed control will be sent out in February for multiple sites.

EAPs: Maps are being updated and should be completed soon. Once the maps are updated, the EAPs will be submitted and up to date.

Dam Upgrades: Site 23-All additional easements have been purchased and signed. Assurances are ready for signatures from the board, once signed, construction can move forward starting with invitation for bids. At this time, the state does not have enough funding for construction and contingencies, therefore, ECWA will need to discuss the additional funding needed. Site 39-Mr. Sanders received confirmation from Brian Carroll, he will be able to conduct work on eminent domain. An appraisal will be required to begin the process.

A motion was made by Robert Fleming to approve the watershed report. Ray Jungmann second the motion. Motion passed.

**Downstream Crossings:** Mr. Sanders submitted a template for a standard policy for downstream crossing assistance. The board discussed percentages of payout, total maximum

funding, distance from floodwater structure, etc. Robert Fleming made a motion to table the discussion. Ray Jungmann second the motion. Item tabled.

**Solar Farm Information:** Mr. Sanders discussed the local solar farms and their inquiries as to the extent of ECWA easements. Some solar companies have made contact with ECWA while others have made no attempt to verify encroachment of easements, etc. Mr. Sanders discussed how ECWA has no restrictions of land use, only flood protection and prevention. Mr. Fleming informed the board of runoff concerns and regulations that may not be enforced. Mr. Sanders stated he would continue to ask for more information from the solar companies.

**Polmer Tax Abatement:** A motion was made by Ray Jungmann to approve the tax abatement between Polmer LLC with 1) City of Temple, 2) Bell County and 3) Temple College. Arvell Jungmann second the motion. Motion passed with one opposed.

**LJT Texas Tax Abatement:** A motion was made by Ray Jungmann to approve the tax abatement between LJT Texas with 1) City of Temple, 2) Bell County. Bobby Henson second the motion. Motion passed.

**Employee Hourly Pay, Salaries & Benefits:** A motion was made by Arvell Jungmann to increase the rate of pay for Calvin Sanders and Tricia Mackie by 5%. The motion was second by Bobby Henson. Motion passed.

Adjourn: Arvell Jungmann made a motion to adjourn. Mike Maedgen second the motion. Motion passed. Meeting adjourned at 8:36 p.m.
