ELM CREEK WATERSHED AUTHORITY Monthly Report – 7/13/2023

Operation and Maintenance

Herbicide treatment was completed at 12 sites last week by Heartland Construction Services. This included broadcast treatment of rock riprap wave berms at Site 1 and Site 36 and excess vegetation adjacent to inlet and/or outlet structures at Sites 2, 3, 4, 5A, 10, 11, 16, 20, 26, and 30. Total cost \$3500.

Heartland Construction Services removed accumulated debris and brush this week from Site 22 and 37 and collected and piled debris at Site 34. Total Cost \$1475. Burning of brush piles is suspended due to hot, dry conditions.

Solar Projects and ECWA Easements

ECWA is working with ENGIE to establish a permanent access route to Site 26 in the Five Wells solar project. ECWA will not be able to travel through the solar farm facilities, consequently the route will be outside their perimeter fence and will require installation of culverts at several locations. ECWA will need to monitor and confirm that the route is completed as discussed and adequate to reach the dam.

ENGIE contacted ECWA with offer to reimburse for time required associated with coordination on the Five Wells and Chillingham solar projects. A review of records showed ECWA has expended about 84 hours to date on Five Wells solar and expects to devote another 16 hours through completion of the project. ECWA has expended about 26 hours on Chillingham solar and expects to devote at least another 24 hours through completion of the project. ECWA requested \$5000 for Five Wells solar – 100 hours @ \$50/hour and \$2500 for Chillingham solar – 50 hours @ \$50/hour. ENGIE has issued reimbursement that should be received next week.

NRCS Programs

No new activity related to NRCS programs.

TSSWCB Dam Repair/Upgrade Program

Site 39:

ECWA has been working with Kat Pinckney and AECOM to assemble information for advertisement of the dam upgrade construction. The Texas State Soil and Water Conservation Board is meeting next week to approve the budget for the biennium that will begin September 1, 2023. The budget should include the additional funds required for this project and we expect to get a formal notification that the funds are certain sometime late next week. With that, ECWA would be able to advertise. A contract could be ready to go by October. ECWA will need to appoint a contracting officer and alternate for this project.

ECWA will be assembling materials to submit to TSSWCB for reimbursement related to land rights costs, including the payment to property owner for additional easement, land appraisal, and legal fees.

Site 23:

Southern Infrastructure Group (SIG) is nearing completion of the dam upgrade at Site 23. Construction of the inlet structure tower and sealing of the concrete is completed. The cofferdam is being removed. Rock has been delivered to complete the wave berm. The old inlet structure has been removed, the conduit grouted, and old plunge basin filled in. Topsoil is being placed on last sections of dam embankment and other areas to be vegetated. Sprigging done in early June is looking good. Areas where

sprigs are not planted will instead be seeded as soon as topsoil replacement completed. Irrigation of sprigged and seeded areas will continue as long as necessary for establishment.

ECWA board approval in the income and disbursements was for a payment request in the amount of \$158,843.16 for the period 6/1-6/30/2023. ECWA portion of the amount is \$2,779.76 (1.75%) and TSSWCB portion is \$156,063.40. ECWA will also receive administrative payment of \$4,681.90. With this payment 97% of the contract total amount has been paid.

Culvert installation on the Crews Family Farms property remains to be done.

Fence installation is underway. A segment of fence on the Coufal Family Partnership property located downstream from the dam is scheduled for layout tomorrow. Mr. Ed Coufal was notified and invited to participate. See separate materials for discussion of perimeter fence layout and related concerns.

The meeting was called to order by Daniel C. Lesikar, Chairman, at 7:30 p.m.

Public Comment: No comment.

Consent Agenda: Minutes: Bobby Henson made a motion to approve the previous meeting minutes as mailed. The motion was second by Ray Jungmann. Motion passed.

Income and Disbursements were read aloud by Tricia Mackie. A motion was made by Bobby Henson to receive, approve and file income and disbursements. John Perryman second the motion. Motion passed.

Budget: No action

Quarterly Report: A motion was made by Ray Jungmann to accept and approve the Quarterly Report as presented. Arvell Jungmann second the motion. Motion passed.

Watershed Report: The watershed report was presented by Calvin Sanders. O&M: Herbicide spraying completed on 12 sites, debris has been piled and burning has been postponed due to weather conditions. Mr. Sanders is working with ENGIE to establish a permanent access to Site 26. ENGIE has contacted ECWA to reimburse for time expended for projects. ECWA requested \$5000 for Five Wells Solar Project & \$2500 for Chillingham Solar Project.

NRCS Pgm: No new activity.

Dam Repairs/Upgrades: Site 39-TSSWCB is expected to approve additional funding next week. Advertising for construction will begin in the next few weeks. Reimbursement for easements is in process.

Site 23-Nearing completion. Inlet tower is complete, the old tower is being destroyed and removed. Topsoil is being placed. Sprigging that has already been completed is being watered and is doing well. The culvert is still awaiting installation upstream and the fence is being completed at this time. Mr. Sanders discussed the issues with the perimeter fence and showed a timeline of hay being fed in auxiliary spillway and other issues with grazing.

A motion was made by Bobby Henson to approve the watershed report. Ray Jungmann second the motion. Motion passed.

General Manager Position: No action

Website Information: The board asked for Richard Stone to possibly attend the next meeting and give additional information as to what he does for Lower Brushy Creek and what he would do for ECWA. No action.

Next Meeting Date: August 8th due to schedule conflicts

Adjourn: Arvell Jungmann made a motion to adjourn. John Perryman second the motion. Motion passed. Meeting adjourned at 9:06 p.m.
