Operation and Maintenance

Summer Inspections

Site visits will be conducted this month to determine need for mowing this fall, along with performance of herbicide treatments and need tor spraying next spring. TSSWCB O&M program funding in FY 2023 (Sept. 1, 2022 –Aug. 31, 2023) will be very limited, and we need to apply soon to compete for funding. Another area of concern will be compliance with grazing policy. With the dry conditions, excessive grazing and livestock traffic can be especially harmful to vegetation on dams and spillways.

Site 5A Auxiliary Spillway/Exit Channel Stream Crossing

Heartland Construction Services completed construction of the rock stream crossing of the exit channel and installation of armored ramp entering the auxiliary spillway at Site 5A on June 27. Application for In-Kind credit for the \$19,250 has been submitted to TSSWCB to apply toward the ECWA 10% share of approved O&M program grants.

Summer Maintenance Items

A service contract has been submitted to Heartland Construction Services for completion of the following items:

-Treat mesquite sprouts at Site 32 and Site 33 (\$350/site)

-Treat brush sprouts in wave berms and plunge basins at 12 sites (\$250/site)

-Clear mud and debris due to beaver activity from riser at Site 21 (\$4250)

-Place large rock riprap under and adjacent to outlet pipe at Site 1 (\$1800)

Total cost of the four items is \$9825 and will be fully funded by ECWA.

Dam Safety

Participated in the annual TCEQ dam safety workshop and NRCS-led online workshop covering O&M and dam safety last month.

NRCS Programs

WFPO Program

A public scoping meeting was held July 6 at the Seaton Community Center to present the planning process for Sites 6R2 and 7REV reevaluation. The meeting was well attended, with about 75 total including property owners, NRCS and their contractor (M&E Consultants), and interested public. Investigations for the plan will be conducted over the next several months to include hydrology/hydraulics, geotechnical, economics, archeology, biological, wetlands, sedimentation, etc. A field tour for the various disciplines was conducted prior to the public meeting.

TSSWCB Dam Repair/Upgrade Program

Site 39:

Land appraiser Les Neugebauer is working on the Benolken property appraisal. Any progress is dependent on completion of appraisal and results. If values are significantly lower than the existing ECWA offer, the owner

could change his mind and accept. Otherwise, .the condemnation process can move ahead with the appraisal in place.

Site 23:

Southern Infrastructure Group is proceeding with construction of the upgrade at Site 23. The ECWA board approval in the income and disbursements was for a payment request in the amount of \$315,885.30 for the period 6/1-6/30/2022. ECWA portion of the amount is \$5,527.99 (1.75%) and TSSWCB portion is \$310,037.31. ECWA will also receive administrative payment of \$9,310.72

Elm Creek Watershed Authority, Board of Directors, met in regular session on July 14, 2022, at 19 South 25th Street, Suite 500, Temple, Texas

Directors present: Arvell Jungmann, Ray Jungmann, Bobby Henson, Steve Rieves, Robert Fleming, Daniel C. Lesikar, Mike Maedgen, and John Perryman.

Others present: Calvin Sanders, Tricia Mackie.

The meeting was called to order by Daniel C. Lesikar, Chairman, at 7:30 p.m.

Consent Agenda: Minutes: Bobby Henson made a motion to approve the previous meeting minutes as mailed. The motion was second by Ray Jungmann. Motion passed.

Income and Disbursements were read aloud by Tricia Mackie. A motion was made by Bobby Henson to receive, approve and file income and disbursements. Arvell Jungmann second the motion. Motion passed.

Budget: Tricia Mackie suggested the 2022 budget be amended by decreasing Tax Increment Zone Payment \$6800 and Elections \$5000, and increasing Professional Fees \$11,800. Robert Fleming made a motion to approve the suggested amendments. Arvell Jungmann second the motion. Motion passed.

Quarterly Report: Tricia Mackie presented the 2022 2nd Quarter Report. A motion was made by Bobby Henson to accept and file the report. Ray Jungmann second the motion. Motion passed.

Watershed Report: The watershed report was presented by Calvin Sanders. O&M: Mr. Sanders will be conducting inspections for determining upcoming O&M needs. Funding from TSSWCB will be limited, but applications for funding will be submitted. Mr. Sanders will be watching closely for overgrazing due to the dry conditions. Site 5A stream crossing has been completed. The payment for this activity will be submitted for in-kind credit with the TSSWCB. Maintenance for mesquites, brush, mud and debris removal, and rock riprap has been contracted to Heartland Construction.

Mr. Sanders attended the TCEQ Dam Safety workshop during the month of June.

NRCS Programs: A Public information meeting for Sites 6R2 and 7R was held July 6, 2022 at the Seaton Community Center. Investigations will be conducted during the next several months.

TSSWCB Programs: Dam Upgrades: Site 39-ECWA is awaiting a property appraisal. Once appraisal is completed, offers may be accepted or amended, or other action may be required. Site 23-Construction is proceeding and on schedule.

A motion was made by Bobby Henson to approve the watershed report. John Perryman second the motion. Motion passed.

2023 Budget: No action.

Site 39: No action.

Adjourn: Arvell Jungmann made a motion to adjourn. Steve Rieves second the motion. Motion passed. Meeting adjourned at 7:54 p.m.
