Operation and Maintenance

Rock Riprap Placement - Site 1 Outlet Pipe/Plunge Basin

Heartland Construction Services completed rock placement beneath the pipe support at Site 1 (see report on file with photos).

Fall Mowing

Mowing completed at 22 sites (215 acres) October 19-22 by Heartland Construction Services. Request submitted for 100% reimbursement through the TSSWCB O&M grant program.

Site 2, Crossing through Easement

Don Wall contacted ECWA regarding assistance with a crossing through the detention pool easement (see land rights map). A review of the site file revealed that this has been brought up previously, but the property owner has yet to make a formal request. Visited location yesterday and found that the "trail" through the property has been neglected and not maintained. The crossing through the easement is not eroded and the side tributary has no defined channel. A low area that sometimes holds water appears to be the result of being gouged out at some point in the past. Recommend sending a letter from ECWA board that the easement does not include any provision for the road and that minor rerouting across the lowest area would afford a passable trail without need for culverts. Owner could relocate above the easement to create a pass across this side tributary (see photos).

Site 10, City of Temple Outer Loop project

The engineering firm working for the City (KPA) contacted ECWA for information on easements at Site 10. ECWA provided information and asked for clarification on proximity to the auxiliary spillway and future access to the site. KPA is including access for ECWA in the drawings, on behalf of the City (see aerial images of outer loop layout).

Site 30, Damage in ECWA Easement

Discovered unauthorized removal of fence and use of dam and spillway as construction route by the Five Wells Solar project. Documented damage and contacted Blattner Energy (construction company) and Engie (solar farm owner) by phone and email with demand for immediate restriction from access in the easement area, plans for restoration of vegetation, and reconstruction of the fence to ECWA specifications. Engie has restricted access and planted temporary cover of winter wheat and will sprig Bermudagrass next spring. The fence will be staked and reconstructed to ECWA specs in its original location upon confirmation and approval by ECWA (see attached sent to Blattner and Engie).

NRCS WFPO Program

Site 6R2 and 7REV Plan Supplement Investigations

Provided preferred contact method collected from respondents to M&E Consultants for access to conduct investigations. We received 5 responses out of 13 properties for Site 6R2 study area, with 4 granting access, amounting to about 190 of the 311 total acres. The remaining respondent rejected the request, contending that the ECWA easement is not valid on their property. We received 12 responses out of 16 properties for Site 7REV

study area granting access, amounting to about 185 of the 257 total acres. M&E crews are planning to begin archeological, wildlife and wetlands investigations the week after Thanksgiving and will be contacting property owners to arrange access.

In a meeting with NRCS and M&E on October 18 there was discussion of a concern that Site 7REV is currently planned as a Significant Hazard Dam. NRCS and M&E were to get a determination from TCEQ as to whether this would meet standards. If the dam were to be required at High Hazard criteria, the cost could far exceed potential benefits and additional land rights could be necessary for the design. These factors could affect need to continue with the investigations and to eliminate the site from future consideration.

Design Deficiency Investigations - Site 19 and Site 34

Met with NRCS to discuss status of these applications and was assured they are making plans to conduct investigations in the near future. Both sites could receive federal funding for repair and protection on wave berms to address erosion concerns.

NRCS Watershed Rehabilitation Program

Met with NRCS to update status of applications on file for federal assistance to rehabilitate sites reclassified from low to high hazard. NRCS assured that applications for Site 8, 21, 22, and 30 remain on the list for planning and eventual design and construction funding. The NRCS program provides 100% of planning and design costs and 65% of the cost of construction. TSSWCB funding priority for dam upgrades beginning in 2023 will require participation and funding from NRCS and is proposing to cover the remaining 35% of construction cost.

TSSWCB Dam Repair/Upgrade Program

Site 4

AECOM is nearing completion of design and in collecting additional data. Assisted AECOM collect foundation drain flow information and coordinated access for additional trenching for auxiliary borrow source.

Site 23:

Southern Infrastructure Group has installed 111 feet of new 42" principal spillway pipe from the completed impact basin to about the centerline of the dam. Drain pipe and filter fill is being installed and should wrap up this week. Beginning next week equipment will be back on site to place fill over the portion of principal spillway already installed and begin placing rock riprap along the wave berm. The ECWA board approval in the income and disbursements was for a payment request in the amount of \$263,888.06 for the period 10/1-10/31/2022. ECWA portion of the amount is \$4,618.04 (1.75%) and TSSWCB portion is \$259,270.02. ECWA will also receive administrative payment of \$7,778.10. Here is where the project stands, overall:

Site 39:

Nothing new to report but another delay and promise from appraiser Les Neugebauer to have the appraisal report to us and the ECWA attorney by the end of the week. The holdup now is the renewal of his appraisal certification. He stated this should have been received over two weeks ago. He did state that the appraisal numbers remain as reported on September 1 at \$9,500 per acre. TSSWCB has indicated that funds are still available to add to the funding agreement, but that could change if this drags out much longer.

November 10, 2022

Elm Creek Watershed Authority, Board of Directors, met in regular session on November 10, 2022, at 19 South 25th Street, Suite 500, Temple, Texas

Directors present: Ray Jungmann, Arvell Jungmann, Mike Maedgen, Daniel C. Lesikar, Bobby Henson, John D. Perryman and Robert Fleming

Others present: Calvin Sanders and Tricia Mackie

The meeting was called to order by Daniel C. Lesikar, Chairman, at 6:29 p.m.

Consent Agenda: Minutes: Bobby Henson made a motion to approve the previous meeting minutes as mailed. The motion was second by Robert Fleming. Motion passed.

Income and Disbursements were read aloud by Tricia Mackie. John Perryman made a motion to purchase a gift card for Linda Patterson for her assistance on our Investment Policy. Motion was second by Bobby Henson. Motion passed. A motion was made by Bobby Henson to receive, approve and file income and disbursements. Ray Jungmann second the motion. Motion passed.

Budget: Tricia Mackie informed the board of upcoming expenditures that will make certain line items over budget. Mrs. Mackie suggested decreasing Maintenance \$10,000 and Downstream Structures \$6000, and increasing Office Supplies \$500, Professional Fees \$5500 and Payroll \$10,000. Ray Jungmann made a motion to amend the budget as suggested. The motion was second by Robert Fleming. Motion passed.

Watershed Report: The watershed report was presented by Calvin Sanders. O&M: The cradle on Site 1 outlet was protected with rock riprap. Fall mowing has been completed with 100% reimbursement available. Landowner at Site 2 has inquired about assistance for easement crossing, but has not made a written request. Mr. Sanders suggested sending a letter stating the easement does not require that ECWA provide such assistance. The City of Temple engineering firm has requested information concerning the easement on Site 10 and the proximity to the proposed outer loop. Mr. Sanders inspected Site 30 to find the removal of all ECWA fencing, and has taken action to remedy the issue with Blattner Energy and Engie.

NRCS Pgms: Mr. Sanders requested preferred method of contact from 13 landowners, on Site 6R2, for access to property for conducting investigations with 5 responses, 4 agreeing to access and 1 refusal. A similar letter was sent to 16 Site 7REV landowners with 12 responses, all agreeing to access the property. A meeting with M&E and NRCS was held to discuss the classification of Site 7REV, it was originally classified at Significant Hazard but may need to be re-classified as High Hazard, which could make the costs outweigh the benefits.

NRCS updated Mr. Sanders on the status of Site 19 & 34 design deficiencies and will be conducting investigations in the near future.

Mr. Sanders met with NRCS on the rehabilitation from low to high hazard dams for Sites 8, 21, 22 &30. The applications are current and TSSWCB could have funding to cover remaining construction costs over NRCS funding.

Dam Upgrades: Site 4-Designs are near completion. Site 23-Principal spillway pipe has been installed with fill over pipe to begin next week. Rock riprap on wave berm will begin next week as well. Site 39-Still awaiting appraisal report to move forward.

A motion was made by Robert Fleming to approve the watershed report. Ray Jungmann second the motion. Motion passed.

County Appraisal Districts Elections for Board of Directors: Tricia Mackie discussed the elections for CAD Board of Directors for Falls County. No action taken.

Contract with CPA: Robert Fleming made a motion to approve the engagement of services with Ludwick, Montgomery and Stapp, P.C. Bobby Henson second the motion. Motion passed.

Financial Institution Signatures: No action taken.

Adjourn: Arvell Jungmann made a motion to adjourn. Bobby Henson second the motion. Motion passed. Meeting adjourned at 8:09 p.m.
